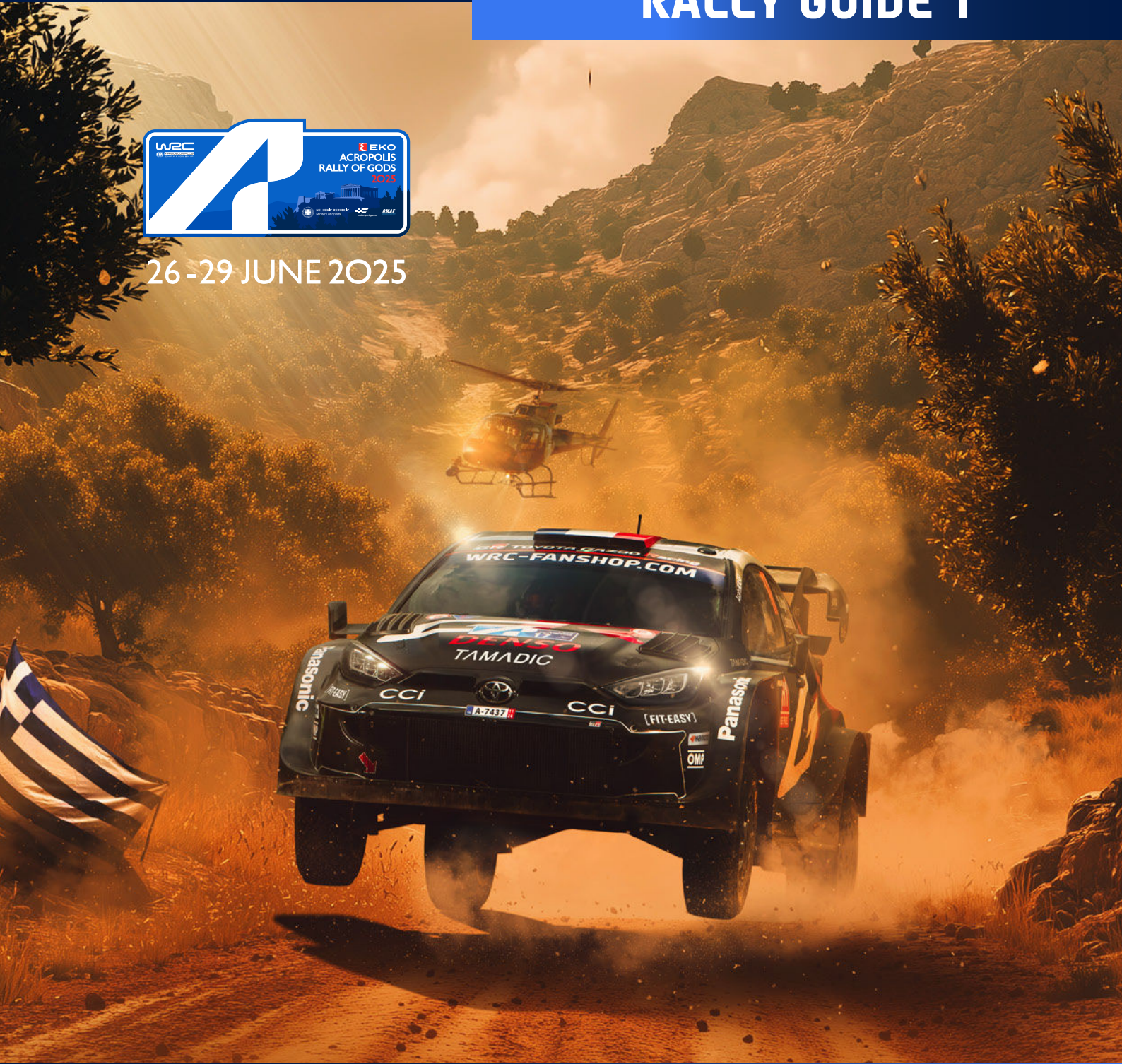

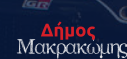

1. INTRODUCTION - WELCOME

We are excited to announce that the prestigious EKO Acropolis Rally will again be a key highlight of the FIA World Rally Championship. This year marks a special occasion: For the first time since 2021, the Greek round of the Championship will take place during its traditional summer dates, specifically from June 26 to 29.

This scheduling shift is particularly significant, as it allows for optimal weather conditions and better state of the special stages.

Fans and competitors alike can look forward to an exhilarating three-day event amidst breathtaking scenery, fierce competition, and the exceptional safety standards that the Acropolis Rally is committed to upholding.

The 2025 edition of the rally will return to its familiar layout while covering an even larger portion of the country. With the introduction of a new special stage, the event will now extend beyond the regions of Attica, Central Greece, and the Peloponnese. Participants and spectators will be invited to experience the region of Thessaly on the now northern part of the route.

Once again based in the welcoming city of Lamia, the Acropolis route on the opening day will feature the well-known special stages of "Aghii Theodori" and "Loutraki," situated in the southernmost part of the event. The day's itinerary includes the "Stiri" special stage, which incorporates sections of the historic route last seen in the rally back in 2001.

The second day will feature the familiar stages of "Pavliani", "Karoutes" and "Inohori". On Sunday, 29 June, participants will encounter an entirely new challenge: the "Smokovo" special stage in Thessaly, near the artificial Lake Smokovo. This year's Wolf Power Stage will be the now-iconic "Tarzan."

Recognising the significant role of the EKO Acropolis Rally in promoting Greece internationally, the Greek Ministry of Sports has been actively collaborating with our sponsors. Together, we aim to deliver a flawlessly organised and highly successful event that showcases the country's rich cultural heritage and stunning landscapes while providing an unforgettable experience for participants and spectators.

1.1 Environmental Policy

EKO Acropolis Rally is committed to the continuous improvement of its environmental sustainability performance in compliance with the National and European legislation as well as with the FIA's sustainability program and its Environmental Accreditation Framework.

Having been awarded with the 3 stars FIA Environmental Accreditation since 2022, the top management is keen in advancing the event's environmental performance and continues "lightening" its environmental footprint with the assistance of all the stakeholders of the Rally.

We focus on minimizing and better managing the waste coming directly from the event's operation, enhancing environmental awareness amongst the participants, volunteers, staff, spectators and contributing to the global fight against climate change, using fewer natural resources, water, energy. Thus, we are encouraging active leadership and participation of all stakeholders .

During the last EKO Acropolis Rally, for the first time we managed to feed our Service Park with 100% certified renewable energy thus minimizing the overall carbon footprint of the event.

Within the frame of its environmental policy, the Organizing Committee, is asking all teams to comply with the following:

- minimize to the extent possible, the waste generated in all phases of the event
- conform with the recycling system implemented in the Service Park by disposing the waste in the appropriate bins provided for: general waste, all kinds of plastic, paper and other recyclables (tins, glass).
- An open skid will be available at the Service Park, for the disposal of large items. Please inform us in case you need to dispose-off items that might be deemed hazardous, by contacting the Environmental Sustainability Officer of the Rally.
- Used engine oils will be collected in cans that will be provided by a licensed recycling entity. Every team will be responsible for bringing its own used engine oils to the collection stations indicated .

The utilization of floor mats for any repairs undertaken either in the Service Park or in the regrouping/refuelling designated areas, is compulsory in order to avoid ground and water pollution.

Washing any vehicle outside the zones designated by the organizing committee is not allowed as, it is not permitted to use any cleaning substances to wash competition vehicles.

If any environmental incident is detected during the event (e.g. accidental spillage of liquids), it must be reported immediately to the organization, so that the action plan established for immediate containment by the defined teams can be applied.

We strongly advise to avoid single use plastics whenever possible in the frame of your operations.

Furthermore, we strongly recommend that the participating teams try to minimize the equipment brought from abroad and search for solutions that can be provided locally, e.g. generators, in order to contribute to our effort for less emissions related to transporting cargos to and from the Service Park.

The Environmental Sustainability Officer is in charge to oversee the compliance with all the environmental protection measures.

Our forests, the flora and fauna, are an important feature of the rally, thus we have to respect and protect them all together. The OC is actively consulting with all national, regional and local authorities on environmental matters. All municipalities involved as well as the competent public services are already assisting in our efforts to reduce the environmental impact.

Your contribution to our effort to minimize the environmental footprint of the event is crucial. Together we make EKO RALLY ACROPOLIS, an environmentally sustainable event.

The maximum number of Competitors is fixed to 75 cars.

If more than 75 entries are received the Organizers reserve the right to decide which drivers among the non-priority will be accepted, according to drivers' results and capacity of their cars.

9. IMPORT OF VEHICLES & SPARE PARTS

9.1 Teams whose country of origin is a member of the EU, but enter Greece from a non-EU country, must possess the following documents:

Document No 3 of the Export Declaration (EDE 2 issued in 4 copies) or the document INF 3. These documents are issued when an EU vehicle leaves an EU country for a non-EU country.

When arriving in Greece the Greek custom authorities will issue a temporary Import Declaration that will be requested upon exiting the country.

9.2 There are no custom formalities for Teams whose country of origin is a member of the EU and enter Greece from an EU country.

- 9.3 Teams or private competitors whose country of origin is NOT a member of the European Union including the UK are required to provide the Greek customs with either:
- A CARNET ATA, which simplifies custom formalities or
 - Teams must bring along a detailed list, signed by the accompanying person in charge, in two (2) copies.

This list should include:

- Full name/address of the person in charge. If a company owns the vehicles, this list should include the details of the company and must be signed by the authorised person.
- Full name of each driver of each vehicle.
- Value of all items to be imported.
- Estimated period of stay in Greece.
- Commercial description of all equipment carried in each imported vehicle (details about each vehicle, number and type of tyres, spare parts etc).

Custom authorities will legalize both copies and will issue a V.F.P card, (VEHICLE FREE PASSAGE), for Greece in two copies. One of these copies, attached to the legalized list, will be held at the customs office, the other copy will be delivered to the person in charge.

So that vehicles and equipment be released from customs, upon departure from Greece, the person in charge must hand in these two documents to the customs authorities, which will verify that all items imported are actually exported, even if they are damaged or destroyed, avoiding thus the payment of duties or taxes.

In the case that their vehicle(s) is (are) registered in a country of the EU then a document showing that the car or vehicle has been hired for the rally signed by the owner will be also requested.

In all cases, the vehicles' original registration documents must be available.

Random checks may be carried out by customs officers to ascertain those vehicles and the onboard equipment are included in the respective lists.

16.2 Media Accreditation & Media Attendance

16.2.1 Press Accreditation Guidelines

The National Press Officer will only accredit the publications / small national agencies (journalists and photographers), websites and radio stations of Greece (a Greek journalist or photographer applies to the National Press Officer of EKO Acropolis Rally). All international media must apply directly to the FIA Communications Department using the online international rally-by-rally accreditation system at <https://wrc.ams.fia.com/login>.

Greek press agencies and the local offices of all major international agencies will be accredited directly by the FIA (e.g., the ANA-MPA must be accredited by the FIA for all rallies, including the EKO Acropolis Rally).

The National Press Officer of EKO Acropolis Rally will accredit the country's major publications and small national agencies, permitting a maximum of three passes per publication/agency after a very strict selection of the accredited media. Three passes will exceptionally be issued to publications/agencies confirming a substantial amount of on-event coverage. A maximum of one pass (journalist only) will be issued to websites (photo tabards are not issued to websites).

16.2.2 General

- Accreditation requests for **nationally based media** (publications, small Greek agencies, local and national radio) must apply until **June 5** through the EKO Acropolis Rally platform, which will be online at www.acropolisrally.gr on **April 26**.
- **International media** (news and photo agencies, print and web media) based outside Greece, **as well as national news agencies**, must apply through the FIA AMS platform: <http://wrc.ams.fia.com/> **no later than June 11**. Applying media outlets are required to upload a formal application letter signed by the Chief editor of the publication or agency, as well as recent proofs of publication of the journalist or photographer to be accredited. No document should be sent by email. For more detailed information on the accreditation guidelines for the FIA World Rally Championship, please see: fia.com

- **International radio and TV media** must apply through WRC Promoter: accreditation@wrc.com (this also applies to any digital media – web TVs, bloggers, influencers etc. - requesting the use of moving images).
- **Media personnel of teams competing** in the EKO Acropolis Rally (team PRs, photographers or videographers) must apply through WRC Promoter: accreditation@wrc.com

16.3 Accreditation Criteria

16.3.1 Publications and agencies

The FIA will allocate annual permanent media accreditation to publications intending to publish reports for every FIA World Rally Championship event during the season (please see paragraph 6 below). Press passes can also be allocated on a rally-by-rally basis to general news, specialist, business and lifestyle consumer publications that do not intend to publish conventional rally reports but whose coverage is considered to be of promotional benefit to the sport.

Exceptionally, a maximum of three representatives (journalists and/or photographers) per publication may be accredited for any round of the WRC. Agencies are subject to the same requirements as publications.

All applicants must fulfil the following basic criteria:

Coverage

For a daily newspaper, a substantial amount of coverage for each event is required. For example, an introductory article in the Thursday edition, follow-up articles on Friday, Saturday and Sunday editions, plus a rally report in the Monday edition.

For a weekly or monthly publication, a substantial amount of coverage for each event is required and a major portion of the overall content should be on the subject of WRC.

Publications or agencies applying for a rally-by-rally photographer accreditation must supply evidence of independent coverage of a minimum of 15 pictures per pass issued at each event they have been accredited for in the previous year's Championship.

Quality

The highest standards of fairness and accuracy are expected as a minimum quality requirement from the press.

Circulation

Accreditation decisions are based on the relative media market in the country of the applicant. As such, the usual minimum circulation for a national weekly or monthly publication is 20,000 copies. For a national daily, the minimum circulation is 50,000 copies.

Freelance journalists must apply for credentials via their own agencies. The onus is on the freelance applicant to prove the supply of regular stories to at least three publications meeting the FIA Accreditation Criteria.

Photo agencies must be able to prove that the pictures have been regularly sold to publications matching the FIA criteria and have been paid for at the normal commercial rate. A publication must be able to prove that the pictures published are the original work of the publication's accredited photographer.

16.3.2 Websites

To be eligible for consideration for Internet Accreditation an applicant must register online and comply with or fulfill (as the case may be) the following Accreditation Criteria. It should be noted that only journalists will be granted website accreditation and only one representative per website will be accredited. The applicant must be a professionally-run website dedicated to reporting on the Championship and its events or a professionally-run general news or sports website with a dedicated Championship section. In each case all and any coverage of the Championship must be free of charge to the public. The applicant must submit satisfactory evidence of publication on the website of news coverage of each Championship event in the previous Championship season, also with the dates of publication, correctly bylined. Please note that only coverage of Championship events will qualify for consideration. General feature articles that are non-event specific will not qualify.

The applicant must undertake to publish for each round of the Championship in the season in which Accreditation is sought as follows:

- at least one news story (of 250 words or more) on each of the Thursday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday;
- at least one feature article (500 words or more) for each event. The representative journalist must be (i) a full-time professional journalist with a national press card (or equivalent) and (ii) must be employed or engaged by

the website as a journalist, wholly or primarily for the coverage of the Championship.

20. HISTORIC FACTS (www.visitgreece.gr)

Lamia is the capital of Roumeli and has 46,406 inhabitants. It is built in the place of the ancient town of Lamia on the southern slopes of Othri near Spercheios River. Lamia is the trade, industrial and transit center of the prefecture of Fthiotida.

The first historic reference of Lamia is in 426 B.C. due to the destructive earthquake that caused damages in Thessalia. In the Middle Ages the town name changed to Zitouni. Lamia played an important role in the 1821 Revolution, the principal characters being Athanasios Diakos and Diouvouniotis. The town was liberated in 1832, recuperated the name "Lamia" and became the most prosperous town of Roumeli. Aris Velouchiotis, the leader of the National Resistance movement during 1941-1944, was born in the region of Lamia.

The very heart of Greece

Central Greece, known as Roumeli, is part of the Greek mainland that has been inhabited since antiquity. There are forested mountain ranges, rivers, lakes, rich fauna and flora and remarkable archaeological sites. Visit the archaeological site of Delphi and the Oracle of Apollo, picturesque seaside towns of Galaxidi and Itea, as well as beautiful Nafpaktos of great historical importance. The lagoon of Messolonghi, the largest Greek wetland, is a natural paradise that includes islets, dunes, forested banks and a rich flora and fauna that provide salt and fish to the locals. But the most precious gift of nature here is bottarga (Greek avgotaracho), one of the few seafood products with a PDO award, a delicacy coming from the eggs of the female grey mullet.

Do you seek the kind of thrill that will pump up your adrenalin? Karpenisi is the ideal destination as there is a multitude of activities for you throughout the year. So, don't waste time, take a trip to the heart of Greek nature and see ravines with impressive waterfalls, dense forested areas and rapid river waters! If skiing or snowboarding is your thing, make a point of visiting Mt. Parnassos and nearby picturesque Arachova Village, the most cosmopolitan winter destination in Greece. Don't miss the well-known archaeological sites at Orchomenos Village, Thebes, Plataiaes, and Chaeronea.
